Words from the Alsherjargothi


I would like to start July off by saying how truly honored I am to be sharing this historic time with all of you. June was a groundbreaking month for the Asatru Folk Assembly.

She made a life that was good, she made it that way. She was a strong woman and a loving mother.



Óðinshof - First Hof of the Asatru Folk Assembly

Midsummer at Óðinshof Celebrating the First 25 Years of the Asatru Folk Assembly

It was the AFA's largest gathering to date, and in spite of the strange times we live in, and assorted "what if" scenarios, it was simply amazing.

Actually, that's an understatement. From the time we began on Friday to our close on Sunday, you could sense the spiritual energy. Knowing the importance of this event, people arrived earlier than usual, so the circle for our "Greeting the Gods" ritual was already crowded. After that came "Genealogy – Honor your Ancestors" with Steven Ingle and Mead-making with Mike Wilde and Ryan Harlan.

Then came the dedication of our Odinshof Cemetery by Alsherjargothi Matt Flavel. Imagine

Worlds, never before witnessed here in Vinland, or anywhere in Midgard for that matter, in many hundreds of years! Then Gothi Thorgun Odden stepped forward and spoke of his beloved daughter Beckah, whose ashes were gently placed into the soil of our sacred site by Gythias

Anna and Sheila. Not a single person left until the last shovel-full of soil was back in place.

After our hearty dinner, we stayed in the hall for two evening talks. The first was "Ascending Afterwards" by Anna Funk, followed by "Immortality – Say Yes to Life!" by Stephen McNallen. By nightfall, with torches lit and fire burning right, we circled into the ritual space, and then circled again, and yet a third time, so we could include everyone in the circle! So many faces, hands, and hearts offering troth to Odin! Odin's might was brought forth through the booming call and response led by our Alsherjargothi Matt. A wonderful sense of expectation came as we reentered the Hof, transformed into a ritual hall worthy of Beowulf and the stories of old! In the hall, lit only by candlelight, seventy or more folk were each handed the magnificent drinking horn - to honor a god...remember a loved one... make a toast...give a word of thanks. As we put closure to the first day of our 25th-anniversary celebration, the might of the Holy Powers was resounding in each of us.

Every meal calls for a food blessing, so after this was done, the men went outdoors to hear the words of our Gothi and Lawspeaker, Allen Turnage give a talk he called "Remaining Men Together." The women gathered in the hall where Anna Funk, Katie Allen, and Sheila McNallen, representing our Gothar, spoke to the women about AFA traditions, our connection with the Divine, and how we are all "living history" day by day. Gathering around several tables laden with flowers and ribbons, the women created their wreaths which they wore throughout the day.

By this time, the Viking Games were well underway with lots of hooting and hollering and masculine enthusiasm, as boulder- tossing, (massive) stone carrying for distance, and a mighty tug-a-war brought forth glee from men of might!

Later, back to the theme of the gathering, Matt Flavel gave an after-lunch talk on the

Svan's Midsummer ritual honoring Baldur,
the shining son of Odin, beloved by all
(except, of course, Loki!). As Svan began
the hammer-warding, we knew we were in
sacred space!. A giant sun wheel was
brought forth, covered with golden ribbons
inscribed by each of us, and then offered
into the fire. Finally, our smaller sun wheel
was set ablaze. The scintillating power of Sunna at Her zenith was felt among us as we filed,
filled with numinous might, out of the circle.

Transitioning to lighter activities, our children enjoyed the new swing set, while adults checked out the vendors and the items that would be up for auction later. By midafternoon, though, the presentation "Travels Through Time" by the McNallens drew people back into the hall, where Steve and Sheila narrated a slideshow covering the entire twenty-five-year journey of the AFA - heartaches and high points, agony and

ecstasy, trials and, eventually, triumph! The presentation ended with the classic "Newgrange Hal" video made for the Indiegogo fundraiser in 2015, showing just how far we had come!

We weren't done, though. Gothi Svan is also the designated leader of our new hof in Linden, North Carolina, now called Thorshof. We were able to present a slideshow of this 1875 historic site, using pictures taken during a recent work weekend. Svan was able to describe the beauty and potential of our new hof, which will be dedicated July 18th. When Svan and others first visited Thorsof in early March, they were intrigued by a lone broken headstone that was barely readable. It was a single grave, though there is a large, well-kept cemetery across the road. What did this mean? Who was buried here, and why? Steve Ingle and Sheila McNallen began research on this presumed man, Philip Bethea. This resulted in two huge binders of information about Philip's ancestors and descendants. These were formally presented, with great applause, to Matt Flavel and Svan Herul for return to Linden, NC.

After dinner, Marc MacLeod and Matt Flavel presented the "Folkbuilder of the Year" medal to Sheila McNallen. The 25th Anniversary commemorative cake, along with ice cream and glasses of champagne, was passed out in celebration of this unique occasion... And now it

Harlan family. The auctioneer was our quick-witted Lawspeaker, Allen Turnage, who was adept at getting people to open their wallets for a good cause. Support was outstanding and brought more money to Odinshof than any previous auction, good news since we'll be making major

roof repairs starting this month.

Mid-morning on Sunday, we again filed into the ritual circle for our Wayfaer's Blot – still 60 or so people strong. The parents of little Alice Shelton asked that Gothi Matt perform a baby blessing for Alice, as she had not been able to have the usual Baby-Naming (Ausa Vatni) when she was born. During blot in Midsummer 2019, we had been told of Baby's Alice's health issues and her hospitalization, due to complications from Down's Syndrome. Finally, a year later, we were able to celebrate with this little one-year-old who has come such a long way!

Gythia Ann Funk led us in the Wayfarer blot in an energy-raising rune galdering. Blessings were offered and received. Truly, the Holy Powers had truly been with us! Safe travels ensued, and all returned home happy and healthy.

Day of Kememorance for Alexander Kud Ivilis

This month we have set aside the 9th of July to honor Alexander Rud Mills. A pioneer of the modern reawakening of our ancestral ways. Alexander was born on July 15th, 1885 in Forth, Tasmania. Rud, as he preferred to be called, was the only boy out of 7 children. As a young man, he moved to Victoria Australia in order to attend law school and subsequently become a barrister, or lawyer. In the 1920's Rud "found" Odinism and began to try to convert others to his new ideas. By the 1930s Rudd had created "The Anglecyn Church of Odin" and by some accounts had upwards of 120 attendees to his regular Thursday night celebrations.

The onset of World War II had Rud advocating a non-aggression policy for Australia. His ideas were frowned upon by the government of Australia and Mills found himself incarcerated in a prison camp for roughly 7 months along with some of the other Odinists of the time. Mills was incarcerated without proof of any wrongdoing or participating in any nefarious goings-on.

Upon his release Mills sought to revive the
Odinist movement in Australia, but many
understood that a part of why he was
interred was because of his "exotic"
religious beliefs. A great many Christian
pacifists and neutrality seekers were never
bothered by the Australian government. His church of Odin did continue on, but in a much
more secretive role and never quite attained the same stature it had once held.

Mills passed away on the 8th of April, 1964. He left behind him a legacy that would reverberate across time and space. Sometime after his passing Else Christensen would be inspired by his writings to found the Odinist Fellowship in Canada. Rud Mills' writings are not always an easy read, comparing his thoughts to our understandings now is a tricky venture. We would do well to remember that what he was creating then and there was completely new, he couldn't run down to a book store and grab the latest Odinism 101 book, there was no internet, there was only research and personal understanding. What Mills manifested there in Australia was the true beginning of our glorious revival, he gave to us a
