Day of Remembrance

Else Christensen

Originally born in Denmark, Else Christensen (nee Ochsner) was one of the leading figures in the modern Asastu movement. As a young woman, she left her hometown of Esbjerg in favor of Copenhagen. It was during her time in Copenhagen that Else awoke to the ideas of National Socialism in the midst of right-wing and left-wing radical struggles. She met and married Aage Alex Christensen, and together they



were members of the Danish Workers Party.

Both she and her husband were imprisoned after the German invasion of Denmark in 1940 for their involvement with elements of the National Workers Party. After their release from prison Else and her husband emigrated to Canada, via England.

Even from Canada, Else continued to nurture her desire to find a place for her own people. It was during this time, while she was reaching out to far-right activists across North America that she first discovered Odinism in a pamphlet titled Call of Our Ancient Nordic Religion, by Alexander Rud Mills. This was the beginning of Else's

dedication to the revival of the worship of the Norse Gods. Her understanding of our relationship with the Gods was heavily influenced by the idea that the Gods were encoded in the collective unconscious of the Aryan race.

In 1969 Else Christensen founded the Odinist Fellowship. Until her death in 2005, Else worked tirelessly for her folk, spreading the word of our faith and our Gods to all who would listen. She founded a prison outreach program that proved to be instrumental to many men.



She wrote and published many publications. Her efforts saw her recognized as the Folk-Mother to Asatruar everywhere.

So, what can we learn from this story?

We don't always know where our stories end. We can't always see the ramifications of our thoughts when put into action. Else was just one single woman. She was a woman who believed in unpopular ideas in a time when those ideas were definitively unpopular. Despite being imprisoned for those beliefs she did not give up.

Our current times are, in many ways, similar to the ones that Else dealt with. They are turbulent and wrought with anger on all sides. We stand at the precipice of a new world, but we have no way of knowing which way the tides will turn. Else didn't turn and run. She stood and faced the future. In doing so she became one of the most important women in the Asatru movement to date.

When things are hard, when public opinion would have you conform, just remember. Your story hasn't reached its end yet, and only you can control the direction the story takes.

Stand strong.
Stand with Else.



Hexennacht at Óðinshof











Hexennacht, six months distant from our Winter Nights celebration, fell into place quite naturally. This was a time to think about women's mysteries and knowledge, as passed down through the ages. In February we "broke the ice" - we did our planting at Ostara - and now it was time to nurture the seedlings for the next harvest!

One of the highlights was a talk by Krystal Podbreger about herbs and other wild plants that our ancestors used. She came with a collection of home-grown and wild herbs, plus lots of stories and the dos and don'ts of native plants.

We also had the joy of celebrating Aubrey Rose Flavel's first birthday! For those who remember her delicate health in her first months, it was a pleasure to see this little sprite as bright and bouncy as can be. She is a blessing to the Folk.

Steve Ingle shared an updated genealogy chart showing our cousin matches using Gedmatch. It must have been ten feet in length; so many people had added their DNA results. For those interested, our main form of communication is through our Genealogy Group on Telegram. We'll make sure that our family-tree enthusiasts will have time to get together at Midsummer!

We finally got to our auction, which had been rescheduled last month. There was lots of laughter and silliness, which is always welcome. In the end, generosity prevailed as we raised many hundreds of dollars for the monthly upkeep of Óðinshof and to purchase food for the food pantry. After a picnic dinner of baked chicken, it was time to ready ourselves for the main ritual of the day.

A modest group gathered in the dim twilight since many families had left for home, but about twenty adults were still with us. A bonfire at the center of our circle blazed as Gythia McNallen led our ladies into the sacred space. Each carried a pair of deer or bear bones, which they hit to make a "click, click" sound. The men then entered, surrounding the women in an outer circle. Each man had a hefty staff of oak, pine, or manzanita. With a heavy "thump, thump," they hit the earth. "Bones of animals, and the "bones" of plants... We resonated with all forms of life on Midgard.

The blot was to Vanadis Freya, also know as Valfreya, as she is the one who leads the Valkyries to and from the battlefield. We called on her strongest, wisest, most courageous, and autonomous self - and on our Ancestors who rest below us in the silence of Helheim. We each sent an unspoken message to those dormant souls, asking them to visit us in our dreams to kindle knowledge, wisdom, and inspiration. Healing herbs were represented by smudging a bundle of lavender from our Ancestors' Table. Fresh strawberries - Freya's fruit - were blessed with her mead and were offered to each person as they departed in the darkness. In the end, all knew that they had again connected with our holy Mothers, and with Freya's formidable power to help protect our Folk.

Later, in a formidable yet beautiful act of womanly magic, our Krystal stood alone in the darkness with two balls of intense firelight by her side. Then into the air they rose, twirling and spinning, as she began her fire-dance - to the "March of Cambreadth" - fire in her dance, fire in our souls, - she engaged us wholly for six captivating minutes. If you have never experienced a fire-dance, you will be greatly blessed at Midsummer this year...

Every monthly gathering is different. May 15th will be our May Day Celebration. Come join us - at Óðinshof: First Hof of the Asatru Folk Assembly - when you can!

Óðinshof Food Pantry Returns







We have scheduled our food pantry for the 3rd Saturday of each month which is the usual date for AFA gatherings. Prior to our April distribution, we announced our return on the Brownsville Community Facebook page and reminded the locals that we distributed toys to our food-bank recipients at Yuletide. The response from the community was fantastic! Within 24 hours, over fifty people "liked or loved" that post.

On April 17th, several AFA members joined the McNallens by setting up tables and unloading boxes of canned fruits, soups, veggies, and other staples. Cars were already lined up as the first bags were filled. These were quickly transferred to cars, but not before each driver was given a warm welcome and an invitation to return next month. In the end, we fed fourteen hungry - and very appreciative - families, totaling thirty-eight individuals.

A similar program is underway at our other two hofs as well, Þórshof and Baldrshof. Hail the Doers!





All of the hard work from everyone involved paid off and we have something great, something the gods smile upon in recognition of our hard work and sacrifice.

Now for the rest of the project that is Baldrshof: There are a few things that need to happen in the next 30 days so that we can stay open and keep operating. Two of those things are putting a privacy fence of sorts up and replacing the front steps that are literally crumbling. These two things must happen by the end of May to meet the state building code to operate. Another and significantly important part of Baldrshof coming to life is that the steeple is in disrepair; allowing rain, weather, and other things in, making costs to repair climb if we don't address soon.

As difficult as it has been to get people to work with us I have managed to secure a handful of project estimates for each project. This is where we need the folk to come together as a community, in Frith, and pitch in. The financial means to do these necessary repairs comes from all of us. We have had a thousand dollars donated already for the steeple repairs. We need \$6000 to do the bare minimum of steeple repairs, \$1500 for the steps, and \$1500 for the fence.

We also have work days coming up the first weekend in May and the weekend of the 22nd for anyone that can make it.

We are nearly there in resurrecting this building to reflect the worship of Baldr, bringing us into the golden age of our people once again.
