


I will adjust these numbers and update you all on progress as it happens. Your generosity is astounding and ALWAYS appreciated.

This begins the winter season. This begins the death of the "world" too dark and cold. We can all see and feel the change in the world around us. Our days are shorter, the nights grow colder. The leaves change and begin to

Get outside and find someplace to sit and feel the changes. Make a hearty meal to share with your family and with the Gods. If you hunt dedicate your first kill to the Gods and Ancestors. Share a choice cut with them. Now is time to begin the "closing in".

Everyone begins to gather closer to home, sticking close to push away the winter drear. Take time to remember what's important.

presence at the 2022 Mountain Fair. As folk-gatherings go, this one featured mountain men and loggers, quilters and bakers, kids and elders. We heard that over 1800 country folk attended. What a great place to share our story.

A Lesson on Freyfaxi

It's beginning to feel like fall here in Montana. Hunting season is in sight, the weather is getting a bit cooler, and fire season is slowing down. We even enjoyed some rain here recently! Since I moved here in the spring, I haven't really had the chance to get out and meet many of our members face to face, but that's changing along with the season.

In lieu of not being able to get out, I recently sent out an email to our members here and asked what they were doing for Freyfaxi, as individuals, as families, or if they had the chance to meet up as a group. This also gave me the chance to talk a bit about Freyfaxi, its origin, the story behind it, and the seriousness of swearing oaths, as evidenced in Hrafnkel Freysgoði's saga. If you aren't familiar with it, you should be! This is where we get the term, or rather the name, Freyfaxi.

Hrafnkel was among the early Icelandic settlers and held a farmstead called Athalból (noble home). He was prosperous there, hallowed the ground, and built a Hof dedicated to Frey, his favored God. Hrafnkel also promised the best of his livestock to Frey, including a horse that he called Freyfaxi (Frey's mane). He swore an oath, in which he promised to kill anyone who rode Frey's horse. He made good on this oath when he killed Einar, the son of a neighbor, who tended after Hrafnkel's sheep. Einar saddled and rode Freyfaxi, while he was looking for lost sheep. Hrafnkel had warned Einar of his oath, and yet, Einar rode him anyway. Upon his discovery, Hrafnkel killed Einar. Einar's relatives took Hrafnkel before the annual Althing, as Hrafnkel refused to pay the

weregild, and was found guilty. He lost his lands as punishment, and they were given to Einar's family, who in turn killed Freyfaxi, and burned Frey's Hof to the ground.

Hrafnkel's story is an excellent example of why oaths should not be taken lightly. As Folk, we are connected through Wyrd, and through our shared Hamingja, or "luck". The oaths we take, directly affect our Hamingja. An oath, made in earnest and kept, builds our shared luck. Oaths not kept, and oaths which are taken frivolously, break it down. If you plan on swearing an oath, be it between friends, within your kindred, or at a larger event, it is always advisable to seek the guidance of our Gothar beforehand.









As for our local members, and goings-on, The Greaney family took a trip up to Hamilton MT for the Highland Games. This wasn't just a chance to enjoy the cultural event though, as family members young, and old, competed in the games, and held a Blót after. Thanks go out to the Greaney family for sharing!

Hails from the Pacific Northwest!

You are where you are in life because of the choices that you have made. You are not a victim; you are responsible for what you choose. Odin the All-father wants us to take control of our lives and to shape this world according to our desire and not react to the

countless things that confront us every day. He does not want us to be sheep led around by some Shepard, giving all our power to some deity that pulls your strings like a puppeteer. When we make the decision to take control of our lives and become accountable for our actions, we begin to align ourselves with our fate by opening communication with our Fetch, the immortal part of us that has been present during all our incarnations here in Midgard. "Work with your fate, not against it", as Guido von List said and you will find fulfillment in life by realizing your purpose or duty here. We chose to be here for a reason, to advance in some way, to experience things that Midgard offers that the other worlds cannot, you must discover this reason.

Once you have made the conscious decision to control your life and connect with your Fetch, there are several things that we can do to help facilitate this which in turn will ultimately bring us happiness and fulfillment. In the following months, I will relate some of those things that will help you realize your full potential, starting this month by what you can do upon waking up and starting the day. These are things that I do every morning and have found to be life-changing.

- 1. Make your bed. This action creates a mindset of productivity and overall health. This is the beginning of a pattern that will lead to a better diet, exercise, and an orderly room that will help clear your mind so that you may focus on the tasks ahead, as well as being able to relax in the evening leading to better sleep.
- 2. Brush your teeth, comb your hair, shave if you're a man, put on your makeup if not, and dress for the day. Grooming will create self-confidence by looking in the mirror and seeing a productive, responsible individual instead of a disheveled hairy mess. You must present to the world the person that you choose to be.
- 3. Now it is time for you to state to the world and the universe the individual you are. We do this by reciting and enacting statements of fact about ourselves, engaging the energy centers of our bodies, and donning our Hammers to show our Troth to the Gods and ancestors.

This is your Daily list, face North, stand at attention, and read this list out loud to the world what you are. The items in the list are merely examples of some of them I personally use. There is a link at the bottom of the article to a document with more to choose from, remember you must populate the list with items that will create the person you are.

TO DO:

1. Energy stretches/awaken the energy of the body. Next month I will describe how

we move and raise energy in the body. Click on this link and learn this stretch, it limbers the body waking you up, and will get the electrical energy in your body moving even if you do not know how at this time. It is a base for us to begin. https://youtu.be/UhFDtwq2o7E

2. Hammer Rite

Now take your hammer and hold it up in front of you elevated at about a 20-degree angle. Imagine a power, an intense light brighter than the sun emanating from it. It is the power of the black sun, another worldly energy that is rising in this dark age of degeneracy that is counter to natural law. This power was known by our ancestors and is now empowering you to greatness! Your hammer is vibrating with this energy, and you can feel this vibration in your bones. Recite the following:

"This day will bring new wonders, great deeds, and boundless luck through the power of the hammer!"

Then don your hammer, knowing that the power of the black sun is around your neck empowering you!

- 3. Check the calendar- Look and see what is coming in your day.
- 4. Anticipate problems with a plan- Think about how you will deal with issues that you will be facing this day.
- 5. Correct posture, stand up straight-

Not only will walking around with your shoulders back and head held high put forth to the world that you are an important person that commands respect, but it also straightens your spine allowing for the flow of energy from your base power center. This energy is known as Vril, Chi, or Kundalini, it is a very real thing and once awakened will connect you with the divine on a consistent basis. We will discuss this more in detail this next month, our posture greatly affects the movement of this energy.

6. Do the right thing-

"Generate your Luck", as Guido von List the Runemaster put forth. It sounds simple, but doing the right thing is very challenging. Drive the speed limit, put the shopping cart in its corral, don't waste time at work, fulfill your obligations. By doing the right thing long enough and acting righteously, you will find those good things will begin to

happen.

Don't do stupid: These are the things that are negative in your life that prevent you from advancing and becoming all that you can be. We say them in the past tense as a fact so that they manifest. Wishes are impossibilities and hopes may not come true; therefore, we say these things in the past as if they have already happened. Below are some examples, choose things that you must stop.

- 1. I did NOT smoke today
- 2. I did NOT lose my temper today
- 3. I did NOT eat junk food today

Values: These are things that will build your character.

1. Be positive- immediately cut off the negative egoic mind with positivity.

This is one of the most important things you must do during the day. The egoic mind exists only here in this world of Midgard and it is very protective of that fact. It creates drama and constant problems to prevent you from connecting with your Fetch, your true self. When thoughts of "I can't", or "I'm not good enough", or "this is impossible", at that instant cut it off and counter it with a positive thought. Positivity must outweigh negativity or the exact thing that you dread will come to fruition.

- 2. Strive for self-respect, self-control, fairness, and firmness
- 3. Remain hopeful
- 4. Be: helpful, organized, hardworking, courageous, patient, kind, considerate, and flexible

Relationships: This is how you interact with those in your life, such as your family and co-workers.

- 1. Don't be reactive
- 2. Listen better
- 3. Do acts of kindness
- 4. Let go of resentment
- 5. Practice forgiveness, and acceptance

Forgiveness is the killer of the egoic mind. When we forgive it frees up an enormous amount of energy and it will feel like a massive weight being lifted. Do not think that for a moment that forgiveness will make you "soft", we must act dispassionately in carrying out our purpose in this world. If you are to be a warrior, you must perform your duty forgiveness or not. We will discuss in the future our purpose in this world,

our duty, and living with our fate.

6. Vibrate Love to your spouse or significant other.

Give this a try and send your significant other some unconditional love, see what happens. You may be amazed at the results.

Myself:

- 1. "Check-in" with myself, how am I? how will I correct it?
- 2. Don't overthink things
- 3. Be strong, be a warrior

Healthy Practices:

- 1. Take calming breaths
- 2. Enjoy sunlight, color, music, good smells, smiles, laughter
- 3. Learn something new, be creative
- 4. When agitated or doubtful, take calming breaths, and clear the mind, and ask my Fetch for guidance. This may come as a decision, inspiration, intuitive thought, or a feeling in the pit of your stomach.
- 5. Count my blessings: These are the things that you may take for granted.
- a. I have good health
- b. I have a reliable car
- c. I have a very good job
- d. I have loving parents
- e. I have a fulfilling purpose in life
- f. I have good friends
- g. I have a loving wife and we are perfect for each other.

Affirmation: This statement sums up you in this world of Midgard.

I care what I do, I choose what I do, I am responsible for what I choose, I am not a victim.

Populate it with the things you want to change about yourself. The things that will make you the best person possible here during your time in this world. Print it and speak it out every morning, you will begin to see positive changes in your life and your desires will manifest. Next month I will discuss some basic ways to move the energy in our bodies, runic meditation, greeting the Sun, and Past positive magic (thoughts and imagery) that will manifest your desires without micromanaging the universe in order

to do so.


Updates from the Odinsfolk Kindred





Rich Bread Braid Recipe

Below is a recipe for one of the many loaves of bread we shared with the Folk. It is a rich sweet bread that was served with a few flavored kinds of butter.

4-5 C flour

2 TBS dried yeast

1 1/2 C milk

3 TBS butter

½ C sugar1 tsp salt

2 large eggs

1 egg yolk

Mix the milk and butter and warm on the stove until the butter has melted. Do not scald it. When the butter is melted, transfer it to a large bowl and add the sugar to it. Then add yeast and set it aside for a few minutes until the yeast blooms. When you see visible foaming occurs, this means the yeast has been activated. Mix in the eggs. Slowly begin adding the flour and salt, working it in as you go. Knead the dough until it is smooth and not sticky. Grease or butter a bowl and place the dough in it. Cover it with a towel and place somewhere warm to give it a chance to rise to twice its size. Fold-out the dough on a floured surface and divide it into three equal-size lumps. Form the dough into three ropes and make it into a loose braid on parchment paper or on a baking stone. Set it aside to rise again. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Whip the egg yolk and brush it on the braid to give it a golden color. Bake for 35- 45 min.

Serve with flavored butter or enjoy plain, hot out of the oven. It also makes an amazing french toast the following day!

Words from Rob Stamm

Greetings, I hope you all are well! Much has been happening in Thorshof District, and even more in the AFA as a whole. This month I'd like to talk to all about how we hallow a space for the ritual to take place.

What is hallowing? Precisely it means to make holy, or sanctify. Most folks outside of

the hofs use a simple ritual opener to make the space ready for ritual and to separate that time and space from the mundane. This can even be done at home at your house altar or on your ancestor's altar. At national events, this is often done before the folk even make their way to the ritual space.

Many of us are familiar with the hammer hallowing, facing the 4 cardinal directions and upward to Asgard, and down to Helheim and reciting a prayer to Thor to make holy the space and ward against Ill intentioned sprites. That is a fine tradition, but today I'd like to offer an alternative: hallowing by fire.

Let me explain briefly the importance of fire to Indo-European tradition. Our oldest contemporary accounts of Aryan religion come from Vedic, Roman, and Greek sources. The Vedic culture saw fire as sacred, and it played a major role in the soma sacrifice ritual. The early Greek and italic tribes preserved sacred hearth fire, a special class of priestess in Rome were tasked with tending this sacred fire and never let it go out. The Greeks and Romans brought this reverence for sacred fire with them as they invaded western Europe from our steppe homeland. The Vedic people similarly took with them east into India and central Asia.

Fire plays a major role of importance to our northern ancestors as well. The sacrificial meal is shared amongst the folk, and a portion and all leftovers are offered into the ritual fire for the essence to ascend to the heavens for the gods. Fire to our earliest ancestors represented a very important gift from the gods. Fire is cleansing, fire is a symbol of the divine light.

So, next time you perform a ritual at home, try hallowing your space by fire. It can be as simple as lighting a candle and saying a small prayer to Heimdall and circling a small space, sunwise. Or as extravagant as carrying a torch and lighting torches arranged in a ritual circle. The prayers accompanying the lighting should be from the heart, ask the gods and ancestors to make your space holy, invite good-natured wights if you like. The fire was an important and holy cleanser and symbol from our earliest beginnings, let's keep the tradition alive.

Until next time, keep the home fires burning!

Vana Njord, let us toast your honor and give to you our Troth! We, your children, call you to the feast.


FREYA INVOCATION




Baldershof Food Distrobution

Land Wights



With Freyfaxi behind us and the harvest season upon us, it seems to be an excellent time of year to discuss the land wights, landvættir, or Rår. Like some of us, and many of our ancestors, begin to work closely with the land during this time it seems important to understand and be aware of the wights right beside us almost every day. There are many terms for what we call in America "Land Spirits",landvættir (Iceland), Land Wights (Germania), or Rår (Scandinavia). All of which refer to some sort of divine nature found throughout Midgard. In relation to man, the wights are typically physically weaker but filled with a divine power that enables them to carry out the function of their nature. This nature in general is rather ambivalent to mankind as a whole but can be interacted with by building relationships with them through the gifting cycle. Much like when we interact with the gods, and our kinfolk, a gift requires a gift.

As Wights are typically highly specialized in their function within nature, be mindful of the powers & natures you are inviting, much in the same way we scrutinize how we share in frith. As with man building a healthy relationship with a wight, should grow your luck, and bring blessings into your life. This practice may also be a great alternative for improving your quality of life, as the gods are typically more interested in individuals willing to help themselves, than those who beg for divine favors. The wights also provide a more subtle but immediate response to an individual's request, than perhaps the gods who are engaged in maintaining the order of our cosmos, or our ancestors who have to work from afar, in most cases.

When working with the wights, treat them like you would when making new friends, they are not beings of worship, but individual spirits like ourselves. Recognize their natures, and keep the ones around you who will help you grow & prosper, as you help them with your offerings to do the same. Also, it is fair to assume, if a wight you wish to interact with is not in your general vicinity, they are likely to be unaware of any offerings you may have left them. For example, leaving an offering for Gammur, when you live in America, Gammur resides over northern Iceland, and you've never been there. Looking into the folklore of locale will provide more fruitful results. Like humans, various wights will have things that delight them more than with others, and the leaving of offering may need to be approached like getting to know a new friend, up to and including learning (or possibly giving) a name. A great start however may be going to your local supermarket and mixing together honey and cream or an item made from within your home. If able locally sourced items are best as the wight likely had a hand in its fruition, and in return for their work we have made something for them in return that only we could provide. In any case, something will be better than nothing, and some trial & error may need to occur. Notate and repeat what works. For more on how to interact with wights a great source is Irish folklore, and some of the Grimm fairytales, as these will not be exact "How to's" and likely wrapped in some level exaggeration for storytelling effect, like other native folklore, are rooted in real life, and have accounts of man interacting with these various wights.


