> **Penny Pointers: Budgets** by Karen Carlson

for anything most of their lives – they just didn't buy anything they didn't need or really want. So this article is not to be taken as "this is how to do it,â€□ but rather as my personal experience. It may give you some ideas as to what would work for you.

My husband and I don't budget for the routine household expenses – food, utilities, gas for the cars, insurance – things which are pretty predictable and generally similar from month to month or at least year to year. What we've used budgets for is the discretionary and semi-discretionary expenditures which are fairly large and don't come on a regular schedule. We have around a half dozen categories of budgeted expenses, including Travel, Home Improvement, and College Fund. Travel is what it sounds like – vacations. Home Improvement does not cover the day-to-day small stuff like a new hose for the yard; it is for the big stuff, both necessary (replace the roof) and discretionary (remodel the kitchen). The College Fund is for the help we send our nieces and nephews for education. Some years there has been one student; some years there have been three in college at once. To even this out, we just set aside a monthly amount and let it accumulate until needed.

Tip for couples: Individual allowances for discretionary spending aren't just for kids. They can save a lot of negotiating and stress. Our allowances cover clothes, eating out, gifts to each other, and things (books, tools, craft supplies, etc.). Some couples have an allowance for only one spouse; we've found that equal allowances for the two of us makes most sense to us. How large the allowances are depends of course on your discretionary income and on what you decide the allowances should cover. The big thing having allowances has done for me (the worry-wart about money) is a sense that there is a limit on discretionary spending; for my husband it gives him the freedom to buy that new router he needs when he sees it at the hardware store without feeling like he has to discuss it with me first.

The nuts and bolts of budgeting should be what works for you. If you're saving for a new car, that's more money than you want to have in a coffee can. If you have more than a couple budget items, it's probably unwieldy to have actual separate bank accounts for them. I keep track in an Excel spreadsheet. There are probably higher tech methods; there are certainly lower tech methods. (Remember paper and pencil?) On a

from our actual bank balance. What's left over (assuming emergency fund and retirement savings are separate) is money we can spend on other discretionary things.
