I am a twelve-year Alaska Army National Guard Infantryman veteran with three deployments to Iraq, and have within the last year become a civilian again. I am the contract State Coordinator for Military Funeral Honors in Alaska as my civilian occupation, which helps me stay current with veteran benefits. When I first joined the military in the beginning of 2003, there was not much for an Asatruar as far as military support. Military chaplains did not know where to go to get Asatru info for their service members, and the resources at that time were limited. Now with the AFA Military Program, service members, chaplains, and leadership have a place to go to assist in the following of Asatru in uniform. My vision as the chaplain for the AFA Military Program is to ensure AFA military members and their military leadership have all resources possible for the practice of Asatru in the military. We will look into our faith from the eyes of a soldier and how Asatru applies to the warrior in order for our Hamingia to grow. Ensuring our soldiers, marines, airmen, and sailors are able to increase their might and main and make the folk strong is a deep passion of mine, and one I will pursue relentlessly. News from the Four Corners from Roland L'Heureux, Apprentice Folkbuilder





Snacks and beverages were served for about an hour and the children were presented with a rune letters coloring book. At about 5:30 the women and children were invited to lead our dinner procession. On the menu, prepared by my lovely wife Debra, was pulled pork sandwiches, chili, chips, and all the fix'ns.

After dinner and prior to our dessert (smores made over an open fire) we held sumbel. To open the ceremony Teresa Szafryk, a kindred sister, and soon-to-be AFA member, presented our Sunwheel to the flame. Representing our runic Yule log, sections of an oak branch marked with each rune were then presented to the flame. The kindred horn was filled and blessed by the women, to be then passed among members and guests who wished to participate. While we enjoyed this time of tradition and custom, huddled around the fire for warmth, we reflected on the importance that fire and the sun had in the worldview of our ancestors, and why the winter solstice event was so revered and sacred to our folk.
