Midsummer in Occidental

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

Family Safety Program: Riots

Riots can erupt for a number of reasons, but disasters, natural and man-made, bring out the worst in people. It doesn't take much sometimes for a small event to turn into an all-out riot. Think it can't happen? It can and will happen when you least expect it. That being said, what can you do to prepare ahead of time to prepare yourself and/or your family in case this scenario does take place?

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the area in which you live? We are all so accustomed to taking the same route we never wander off the beaten path to take the time to discover other routes or to see what is in our area. Take a look around. Figure out two or three escape routes. If you drive home a certain way every night, figure out different routes to take.

Second, but just about as important, do not panic. Staying cool, calm and collected is always the best and safest thing to do when anger rises and tempers flare. Once a riot starts, everyone who is involved will feel the adrenaline rush and their survival mode will kick in. You don't want to be one of these people but instead someone who can think rationally and lead others to safety. And, walk, don't run to wherever it is you are heading. Don't bring attention to yourself or others. Then there's your family. Make sure you have reviewed safety measures with everyone in your family and household.

A typical day has everyone scattered: at school, at work, at the gym, etc. Make a plan to meet in a safe place and then escort everyone to a designated safe zone. As you leave the riot area safely, lock elbows with everyone in your party. There is something to be said for the old saying "safety in numbers.â€□ This may seem counter-intuitive, but don't be a hero. Stay neutral. Do not get involved in whatever is taking place. You might think you are doing the right thing by aiding someone but you need to stay as far away as possible. You do not want to get yourself, your family, your neighbor or anyone in your group harmed. You have to remember that these people are not thinking correctly and are irrational.

If ever there was an occasion to bug-in, a riot is it. If at all possible, move inside and as far away as possible from the riot. Stay away from windows and don't be an onlooker. You never know what someone is thinking and in the heat of the moment they might decide to do something to remedy the situation. And stay in the loop. Tune in to your local TV station or keep a radio on hand to hear the latest updates on how and when the riot has been contained. Get a scanner and listen to local S.O. and Police. Again, the safest place to be is inside with your doors and windows locked. Law enforcement will keep citizens apprised with the latest updates and let everyone know when it is safe to resurface.

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good idea to keep just in case of such emergencies.



In the aftermath of any sort of disaster, people become more and more likely to explode. Ancestor Worship in Asatru by Jeff Wolf

Not long ago I was hospitalized; I had a case of pneumonia and other complications that tried their best to kill me. The AFA was there for me during that time. Lying there in the hospital, thinking on my life and feeling the presence of my Ancestors near, feeling my wife Diana gently squeezing my hand, I had plenty of time to think about those things in life that REALLY matter: Our faith, our folk and family, our Gods and Ancestors.

It was those things I believe in, those things I proudly stand for, wherein I found the will to live. The elder folk we call our ancestors knew the importance our Ancestors held for us as a People. They were considered a living part of the family. Not only did they birth our lines, they passed them on, and they protect our lines, even today. Many folks, myself included,

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at least it is my opinion, that modern heathenry/Asatru/etc. in many versions is extremely Gods-centered, almost to the point of excluding the Ancestors. Often it seems the Ancestors are given little more than lip service. Perhaps I was fortunate being raised in a family deeply focused on Ancestry, and finding Asatru only strengthened that firmly held veneration for my Ancestors. Needless to say, Ancestor worship is a strong part in my own daily LIVING ASATRU. Ancestor worship does not need to be fancy; we are not talking about a large community blot; we are most often talking about something going on within our own homes.



One idea for connecting more consciously with the Ancestors is creating a spot in the house where they are showcased. Diana and I have a hallway with Ancestor pictures lining both walls; since we pass through the hallway often, it is a constant reminder of where we come from. In our home we frequently share our meal with the Ancestors, giving a portion of the meal to them on our household stall. Inviting the Ancestors IN to your home makes a great difference. Anyone who has been to our home will testify that our home is ALIVE with spiritual energy. The presence of our Ancestors brings into this world a spiritual might that has accumulated over many, many years. Many folks, myself included, believe our Ancestors can give us more attention than the Gods can; they have a vested interest in us,

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misplaced your television remote control. Our Ancestors, on the other hand, seem to be more interested in the daily activities we all experience.

It is a common practice among many modern Asatruar to focus their prayers based on the day of the week: Monday is Mani's day, Tuesday is Tyr's day and so on. I have been using Saturday for the worship of the Ancestors for many years now, usually the Disir (Idesa to you Anglo-Saxon oriented folks) although at times to all the Ancestors. Here is one prayer to the Ancestors I have written.

Wassail Tribe's mothers

Watchful Women, Weal-bringing ladies
Good wit you have, wise dreams you bring
Runes you share, good rede you give
Elder brides, our forefathers' strength
Nurturing mothers, and fierce defenders

Watch over us mighty mothers, keep us whole
Reward our good deeds, make straight our misdeeds

Steer us to right ways, teach us good thew
Hold us in Frith, and good luck too!

I generally dislike using formalized prayers, preferring a more spontaneous approach, although I love to write prayers. Strange, huh? Well, maybe they could benefit someone through my sharing them. Here is one more short prayer.

Wassail Idesa! Wassail Elder Mothers!

Tribal Mothers, many a truth you hold

Speak to us great ones, share with us rede

Push us onward, prosper us with peace

Our moods you lighten, like day's drighten

Warding our dreams, the mares you drive off

Always with us, aiding and aiming us

Move us toward right deeds, and much renown

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Old English at times, but I use them PERSONALLY, not in a communal setting, because all the listeners do not necessarily know Old Norse or Old English, or whatever your elder tongue of choice might be. Sure, we all have Ancestors who spoke these languages, and taking the time to compose them a prayer in one of those tongues is a fine gift to offer them, but it is not necessary. The language of OUR land is acceptable.


Some people recommend an altar separate from the Gods altar for your Ancestors altar. I have combined the two for nearly 20 years and it has worked fine for me. I have images of the Gods alongside family heirlooms, and it works for me. You decide for yourself what is right.

Anyway, I appreciate you taking the time to read this little ramble of mine. I am not a scholar and do not pretend to be one. I have been LIVING ASA TRU for nearly 20 years now and can at least speak from my own personal experiences. In my experience, I have found that worshiping my Ancestors has strengthened me and my family in ways too numerous to mention here. If Ancestor worship is not a part of your daily Living Asatru, then try it and experience it for yourself. Remember...

We said farewell to our newlymet kinsmen and began our journey back to our home cities. Charged by the power of Walpurgisnacht, facing the beauty of spring on May Day, we had forged tighter bonds with kinsmen from distant corners of our great state.
