

Hávamál, Stanza 38 is the name sake of our training team, for it reads: Let a man never stir on his road a step without his weapons of war; for unsure is the knowing when need shall arise of a spear on the way without.



We are a Folkish training team focused on empowering members of the folk both men and women to be able to keep Hávamál 38 at all times as since we are not permitted to carry "spears" in public and having concealed weapons are a right often infringed upon in this age, the ability to make one's Mind and Body a weapon is the focus of our training.

We teach Muay Thai Kickboxing as this 8 Point (fists, elbows, knees, shins) and thus the most complete striking system. Specifically teaching the Dutch Kickboxing Style as this is widely accepted as the best form of the 8-Point Kickboxing System. We also teach Boxing, wrestling, and Brazilian Jiu Jitsu.
